Dr. Barri Tinkler – Dr. Sawyer reported Dean Hough asked that RFT consider having Dr. Tinkler in the RFT Dept. and fully tenured. Tenured faculty stayed after meeting to discuss. Dr. Tinkler was voted into the RFT Department with tenure.

Information Items:

Nixa Dual Credit and Banking – Clay Hanna – Director of Secondary Education from Nixa– Clay reported offer an introductory education course (junior/senior students) try to help recruit and “grow our own” teachers from our students. Science/math is a hard area to find teachers for. Need to hook students early and show them that being a teacher is a good career. First semester is a seated course and second semester is out completing a practicum. Make sure the students are placed in a positive setting. There are two areas in core data for DESE, but the vocational area is best for Nixa. It is through family consumer science vocational called Practicum in Teaching. EDC 249 course possibly use since it would transfer as a GenEd course. Possibly create a course EDC 155 which would take a year to complete. Taught by a Nixa teacher, reduce tuition fee for student, and bank credit for a class to take at MSU. Nixa will have a new course “Cadet Teaching” taught by Stephanie Pycior. 80% of Nixa students take dual credit courses. The practicum would also count toward their A+ program requirement of 50 hours of tutoring.

CAEP Formative Data Collection – Judy Gregg reported they have uploaded the CAEP self-study into AIMS on January 29th. CAEP will assign a team to critique the self-study. COE will receive a formative feedback report. COE will continue to collect data based on the five standards plus the cross cutting themes of diversity and technology. The site team will be here November 3 – 5, 2019. A folder has been

set up in Sharepoint and this is where collection of data from your programs will be stored. Data needed is anything that is of value information. Any assessment data used to make program changes. Include date, attendees and their title, and the results of the meeting. Make sure it is something that CAEP wants to see; changes, monitoring the progress of our students to make the best teachers. Update and changes to CIQAPPs will be in a separate folder – keeping originals. Self-study is on COE website.
