Action Item:

Approve August 14th Faculty Minutes; Dr. Sheffield moved to approve; Dr. Swearingen second; approved.

Information Items:

Strategic Hiring Plan Update - Dean Hough reported fall enrollments are up so COE will receive extra money. Move forward immediately with the literacy search and multicultural search. The Budget Committee approved to increase all Assistant Professors beginning salaries to \$55,000. Dean Hough met with the donor of the Hispanic Initiative and he still does not want to change the name. Get the committees in place for the literacy and multicultural positions as soon as possible. Starting dates will be up to RFT. Dean Hough will meet with the search committees. Dean Hough wants us to network one-on-one as best as we can with our sister institutions; Pine Bluff, University of Memphis, University of South Alabama, and possibly Alabama State to get a good pool of candidates for both of these positions. Leadership Council agreed the two clinical faculty positions assigned some amount of time to do some professional work would be best housed in CLSE. COE is making good progress on recouping our tenured track faculty lines. Dr. Brown reported clinical faculty may align with the ed admin program and would direct the RPCD. The other clinical faculty position would teach courses as needed and at the same time be available to help in the Field Services Dept. in regards to placements. This person will be reporting to two supervisors. Dean Hough reported the Faculty Advisory meets September 2nd and they are going to come up with a new strategic hiring plan. Dr. Aram will come up with suggestions for the Faculty Advisory. The plan should not focus on if someone retires and then have to be replaced. The plan should focus on where should we start growing programs, put our money, and look at that as a college. The child life program has the potential for growth. If the new MATL/SETL degrees grow, do we want to put some resources there? The Oct. 2nd meeting will discuss what do we need to do as a college? Where do we want COE to be at in five years? Dean Hough reported search committees are appointed by the department head and he is the hiring official.

Certificate in American Education Practices plus a separate certificate for undergraduates. Not going to be housed in RFT, will be in CLSE because the professors are coming to receive information on higher education. It is a good fit because they are already putting together a graduate certificate in student affairs in higher education that will be different from this certificate, but has common elements. Depending upon the topic, RFT faculty may be able to teach a semester. Also, develop a certificate for the undergraduates; does anyone want to be on the committee; no one interested.

Does RFT want to have a travel budget committee? Currently, RFT faculty receive \$500.00 for travel. The other departments have gone to a different method. They have a travel budget committee and when you are going to a conference, you send your proposal, the committee reviews it, and they decide yes or no and the amount of funding. RFT does not want a travel committee. Keep baseline \$500.00 and at end of the semester review funding and distribute remaining funds. Don't forget to send travel requests by September 14th. Estimate cost of trip.
